TERMS AND CONDITIONS



The competition will be judged to select, in the opinion of the judges, the best entries in the following three categories:

CATEGORY 1 - Short Story

- Entry Fee \$15 per entry
- First Prize only \$2.000
- Must not exceed 3,000 words

CATEGORY 2 - Contemporary Poetry

- Entry Fee \$15 per entry
- First Prize only \$2,000
- Must not exceed 200 lines

CATEGORY 3 - Children's Writing Awards (16 years and under)

- Entry Fee \$5 per entry
- First Prize \$200, Second Prize \$100, Third Prize \$100
- Children's Short Story entries must not exceed 1,000 words, or
- Children's Poetry entries must not exceed 30 lines (excluding title)
- Please provide age as at 26 April 2019 on Entry Form

ENTRIES CLOSE Friday 26 April 2019 - NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE CONSIDERED

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Entries including entry form and entry fee must be received by Friday 26 April 2019
- Entries must be the unaided work of the entrant
- Entrants name must not appear on the work
- Entries do not have to be written in the same style as the work of Banjo Paterson or in 'bush' style. The awards are aimed at promoting Australian writing and writers. The only requirement is for Australian content
- Entries previously published will be considered by the judges providing no payment was received Please include publishing information as requested under Entry Details
- Entry forms available from www.cwl.nsw.gov.au, phone (02) 6393 8120 or collected from Orange City Library
- An entry form must be completed for each entry submitted
- Entry forms may be photocopied
- All entries are to be available for reproduction or publication by Orange City Library with copyright being retained by the author
- Winners will be notified by phone on Friday 5th July and announced at the Orange Readers and Writers Festival on 3 August 2019
- The list of winners and their winning pieces will be available at Central West Libraries website www.cwl.nsw.gov.au. The winning Short Story entry will be published in the Central Western Daily newspaper
