
If you visit Orange City Library you



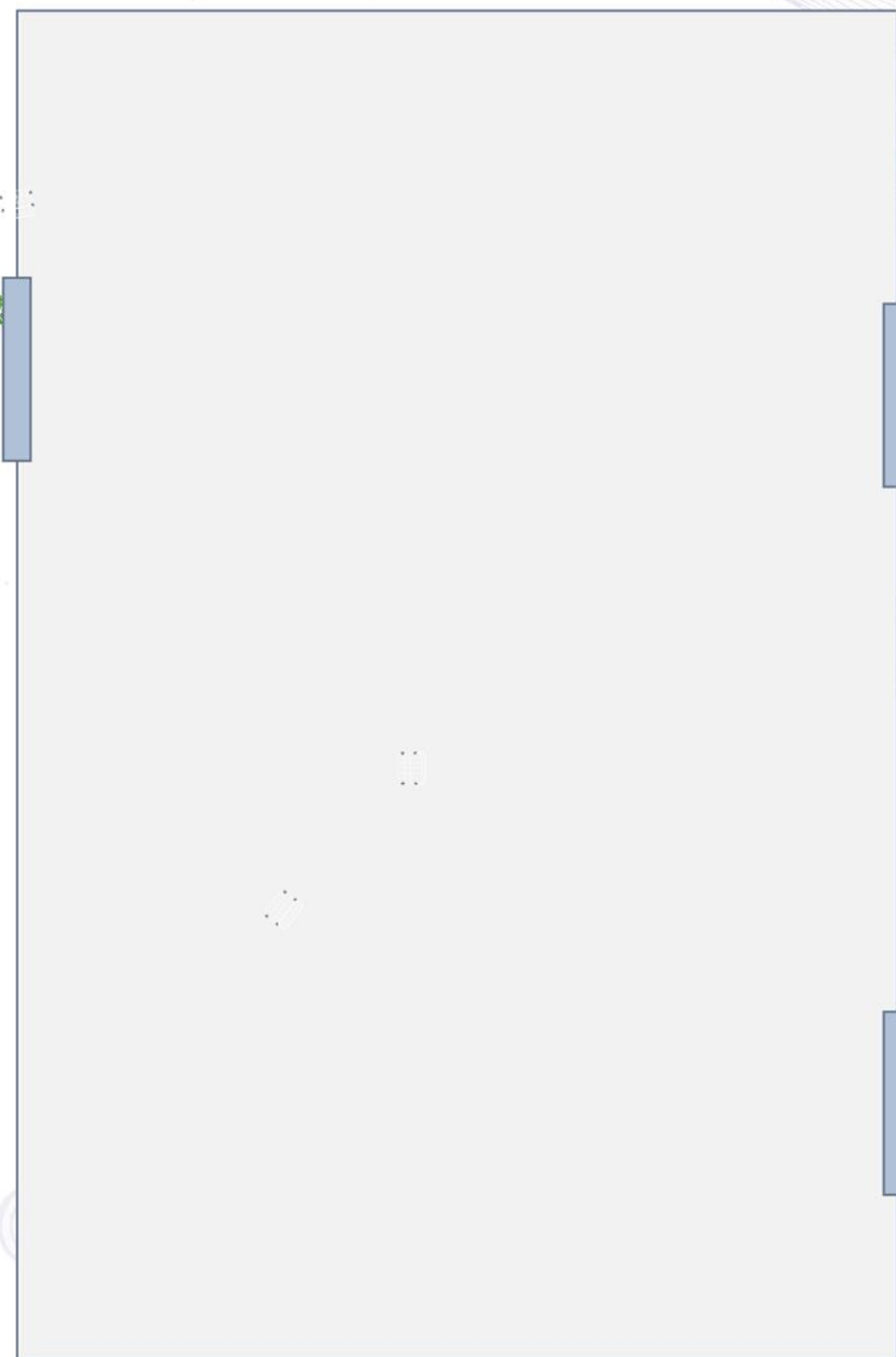
